NH ARES Major Announcement

A general announcement of this news will be disseminated to other ARES members and our served agencies sometime later this week. The ARES leadership team has long recognized that the addition a Mobile Communication Vehicle to our arsenal would significantly enhance our communications effectiveness. There had been a couple of earlier attempts to secure such a vehicle dating as far back to the Ice Storm of 1998. It became apparent to the leadership some months ago, that if NHARES was to continue to evolve we needed to fill this void.

Last week, a 10-passenger shuttle style vehicle was purchased for NHARES. The vehicle is in remarkably good shape, needing only minor bodywork, the design and construction of interior operating stations, and the addition of appropriate ARES markings. Pictures will also be available on the NH web site www.nhradio.org sometime after the first of the year.

There are a number of ways that you can support this project. You can help by donating any surplus equipment you may have that fits our needs or you might consider making a cash donation toward the purchase of specific equipment. The leadership teams is now developing a comprehensive list of equipment needs, based on the premise that vehicle will have at least three operating positions, a station each for HF, VHF/UHF and Digital

communications, all with appropriate back up equipment. We also anticipate that this vehicle will have capability to communicate directly with our served agencies. The portable 2-meter repeater (147.06 MHz - W1AKS) will also be stored in this vehicle. Some pieces of communications and computer equipment have already been donated.

Any ideas you may have in obtaining equipment would be greatly appreciated. We are also soliciting ways to configure the vehicle with types of equipment and antenna systems.

Anyone who donates equipment, funds or services will be suitably recognized for his or her contribution on a plaque that will be affixed inside the vehicle. There are other initiatives that are in process that will be announced shortly that will further enhance the effectiveness of NHARES.
